Fort Worth World Cup League 2022

Rules and Information

RULES

- Eight owners will draft six teams each.
- **NEW RULE:** World Cup teams may be drafted twice; the owner taking a team the second time earns ½ points. You may own the same team twice--if you dare!
- Draft order determined randomly, with order reversing in even-numbered rounds (i.e., team that drafted sixth in the first round drafts first, team that drafted fifth drafts second, and so on)
- Owners earn one point per win (including the July 14 3rd-place game) and ½ point per tie
- In the event of a tie in our final overall standings, first tiebreaker is final World Cup standing of best team on an owner's roster; second tiebreaker is cumulative goal differential for all six teams
- Owners may not drop, add, or trade teams
- Overall winner will bear the title of "World Cup Genius;" second place earns the title "Right Clever Fellow"

WORLD CUP

- 32 teams compete
- first round puts teams in groups of four (Groups A through H); each team plays every other team once, and top two go to next round
- next and all subsequent rounds are single elimination
- games start on November 20 and end December 18

NOTES REGARDING NEW DOUBLE-DRAFT RULE

- Over the last four World Cups, the top team by our scoring system had either 6 or 6.5 points (never has this been the team that actually won the World Cup!).
- Thus, the second team to draft the best performing international team will get in the range of 3.25 to 3 points.
- According to the last four World Cups, that's the equivalent of a team that finished 11th or 12th overall.
- In other words, if everyone drafts perfectly it becomes worthwhile to consider drafting already drafted teams once 11 or 12 other teams have been selected.
